IMMIGRANTS RECOGNIZED

The 2021 Immigration Recognition was held on May 16, 2021 in the Hanslik Hall at 10:30 a.m.

<u>Descendant Certificate Recipients: Deborah Svatek-Logue, Pat Heimann Hackworth, Dennis Svatek, Jr., Michael Svatek, Matt Hackworth: Vojtech and Marie Riha Svatek arrived on November 12, 1902 on the Frankfurt from Driten, Southern Bohemia and settled in Fayette County, Texas. Vojtech was a farmer and a carpenter and helped construct Sts. Cyril and Methodius Catholic Church in Shiner, Texas. He was a longtime member of the KJT.</u>

Descendant Certificate Recipients: Nick Macik, Tommy Prasifka, Dennis Sykora, Donna Willett: Joseph and Marie Krcma Macik arrived on June 24, 1906 on the Cassel from Kasava, Zlin and settled in McLennan County, Texas. Josef, Marie and daughter Marie boarded the ship together, however, their daughter Marie died aboard the ship and was buried at sea.

Descendant Certificate Recipients: Tommy Motal, Phyllis Teykl, Mark Jasek, Vaclav J. Jasek: Josef Roman Jasek arrived in 1882 from Frenštát and settled in Novohrad, Lavaca County. Josef received an education in Jicin, Frenštát and attended the University of Prague where he majored in music. He married Marie Janacek, established a nursery in Novohrad, developed the Novohrad school system, and was a president of the Texas KJT organization.

Dr. Lester Kitchen was born in Port Arthur, Texas to Lettie Louise Lester Kitchen and John G. Kitchen (football coach at Austin High, 1947-1954). Schooling was Rosedale Elementary, Baker Jr. High, McCallum High (1st Year it opened), Arlington Heights High, Ft. Worth, Oklahoma State University, and University of Houston College of Optometry. Lester began practicing two years in Lubbock, Texas and then two years in the U.S. Air Force in Aurora, Colorado before returning to Austin to practice Optometry for 52 years.

He is survived by his ever-caring wife Carol, son Brian Kitchen and wife Peaches, daughter Elizabeth Dina, grandsons Nick and Cameron Dina, granddaughter Hilary Chapa and her husband Steve, sister Linda Fogle and her family, Kris Sullivan and his wife Melinda and their children Kyle and Rose.

In 1951 he was blessed to pitch for the Little League World Series Championship Game in Williamsport, Pennsylvania; unfortunately, the team lost 3-0.

Czech Heritage Society of Texas held their State Genealogy Conference in Hallettsville, Texas

July 24, 2021: Speakers at the genealogy conference were on the agenda for the day. The presenters were from three of the fraternal organizations and geared their presentations toward informing the audence of 105 attendees on the early history and goals of their organizations. The four organization that were to present were KJT, KJZT, SPJST and RVOS. Unfortunately, representatives from KJZT were not able to attend at the last minute.

Three of the main reasons that the fraternal organizations formed were: a) the early members of these lodges took solemn pledges to take care of the sick and help support the widows of deceased members with small children, b) sick benefits were paid to those in need and in more serious cases other lodges also contributed cash, c) and, when a member suffered a serious accident or his home or property burned, the membership lent a hand with donations of clothing, bedding, food and cash.

The state meeting was held in the afternoon and three of the CHS of Texas chapters were recognized for their many years of service: Harris County CHS is celebrating 35 years, Lavaca County CHS and Bexar County CHS are celebrating 30 years.

CZECH HERITAGE WEEK IN TEXAS IS APPROACHING

Excerpts of an article written by Willie Mae Cervenka in 1996.

The third week of October was chosen by the 74th Legislature of Texas in 1995 because of its historical significance. Czechoslovakian independence was proclamed on October 28, 1918 and this gave Texas Czechs the opportunity to commemorate and remember their heritage. You can celebrate it in your local community.

Suggested guidelines for school teachers, religion teachers, parents and Czech organizations could include:

- 1. Contact school superintendents and principals as soon as possible, so it can be included in this year's curriculum. Offer presentations in the social study classes.
- 2. Paint or sketch posters, or cut out illustrations on Czech Republic and display in classrooms, halls, library, downtown shops, malls, and bulletin boards.
- 3. Display Czech Republic flag with U.S.A. and Texas flags if possible.
- 4. Ask students to write a short article on Czech Republic, "What Czech Heritage means to me", or on anything they know about the Czech Republic or Czech-Americans living in Texas.
- 5. Teach students a greeting in Czech: Ahoj, Dobry den, Na Shledáno, Vitame Vas, and Nazdar.
- 6. Adopt a school in the Czech Republic.
- 7. Contact Pen Pals in the Czech Republic
- 8. Learn a Czech song or a short dance routine. Play a video or cassette featuring "Annie In The Cabbage Patch" "Red Handerchief Round you Go" or "Beseda". Ask students to participate in dancing.
- 9. Develop a Family Tree. Distribute generation charts to students to take home and trace their roots for future descendants. There are nine volumes of "Passengers Lists", written by Leo Baca, have listings of passengers, port of entry, and names of ships on which they sailed.
- 10. Plan a trip or school tour to TCHCC.
- 11. Take trips to Czech museums in Texas and the Institute of Texan Cultures in San Antonio.
- 12. Present Czech programs, music, and singing of Czech songs, at nursing homes, hospitals, and veteran hospitals. Provide this during meal time in the dining room, or lobby. Feature singing and Czech music at shopping centers making people aware of Czech Week.
- 13. Show and Tell--share your travel experience in the Czech Republic and items of interest from there.
- 14. Restaurants: feature Czech menu during Czech week. Add a little something to a hamburger and call it 'Czech A Burger'.
- 15. Secure a Proclamation by the mayor of your city.
- 16. Prepare margue signs that reads "Czech Heritage Week Texas. Third Week of October".
- 17. Newspaper/Media: Submit Czech recipes during that week. Submit an article about some Czech notable, Jan Komenský, "Father of Education", T. G. Masaryk, President of Czechoslovakia, Vaclav Havel, president of the Czech Republic. Czech composers, Antonin Dvorak, Bedřich Smetana, Leos Janacek, Jaromir Vejvoda, composer of Skoda Lasky. Czech National Anthem "Kde Domov Muj". "Where is My Home", published in the Czech and English version. Newsreporter could interview some early Czech settlers in Texas. Highlight Czech businesses in your town.
- 18. Radio: Contact radio stations about placing special emphasis on Czech music and programs.
- 19. Television: (book early) Set up interviews with exchange students from Czech Republic or anyone visiting here from the Czech Republic.
- 20. Give special recognition to the oldest lady or gentleman of Czech descent in your city. Write a profile and have it published.
- 21. Have children tape record an interview with their grandparents or great-grandparents.
- 22. Plant a tree. Oak (dub) or Linden (Lipa), or a rose bush. These grow in the Czech Republic.

Czech Ladislav Kouba (an American Citizen) and his Family

Rome Milan

January 29, 1959 - April 23, 2021

Fort Worth, Texas - Rome Milan passed away April 23 after a 3-year battle with ALS, Lou Gehrig's Disease. His gymnastics filled life began as a young gymnast competing for Sokol Fort Worth, then Euless Trinity High School, followed by being the captain of the gymnastics team at his beloved University of Texas in Austin. After graduating, he started his high school coaching career at Weatherford High School then Boswell High School. During those years, his teams qualified for the state championship 14 out of 18 years. After a break from coaching, he returned to finish his coaching career for the Birdville School District until his diagnosis with ALS.

In addition to competing and coaching, Rome was also an international gymnastics judge and also held numerous positions at state, national and international competitions including the Pan American Games, Goodwill Games, World Championships and Olympic Games. He served on the USA Gymnastics Board of Directors and Advisory Council, the Gymnastics Association of Texas Board, and the Texas High School Hall of Fame Committee. As an avid gymnastic historian, he curated a vast collection of vintage memorabilia which he loved to share and display.

He was a lifetime member of Sokol Fort Worth and SPJST Lodge 154. He filled many positions including serving as the American Sokol Southern District Director of Men and on the National Board of Instructors.

While attending the 1972 Summer Olympic Games in Munich, Germany with his parents and brother, the Olympic flame ignited his lifelong love of gymnastics and all things Olympics. He attended a total of 12 Summer Olympic Games and had the honor of running a segment in the Olympic Torch Relay in Rome, Italy before the 2006 Torino Winter Olympic Games. Of his many collections, his Olympic torch and pin collection were some of his favorites. Rome was a pin trader extraordinaire and was known internationally for his collection. While attending the 2016 Rio Olympic Games he was recognized often while proudly wearing patriotic shirts and waving a large American flag at events. He had a knack for being in the perfect spot to show up on camera during television coverage. His many TV sightings prompted NBC to challenge viewers to "Find This Man Everyday" on one of their Olympic broadcasts.

Rome was an established impressionist artist whose artwork was represented in several art galleries across the country. Many knew him as the artist that would paint in the window at Milan Gallery in Sundance Square, always wearing one of his many crazy hats and listening to The Beatles.

A surprise performance was held in Rome's honor on April 18th at Sokol Fort Worth by a group of former gymnasts, friends and family members. A special routine was choreographed for him with songs from The Beatles. He watched the routine and saw many friends and family who were there to show their support.

Rome was preceded in death by his infant daughter, Matisse Milan. He is survived by his wife, Pauline; children Paris, Sydney, Athens, stepson Matthew David and Caity Gregory. He is also survived by his parents; Jerry and Henrietta Milan, his brother and travel companion, Tal and wife Lesli, and his special Czech sister, Vera Janeba. Rome leaves behind a huge family of "favorite" cousins.

Rome was truly one-of-a-kind. His infectious enthusiasm touched the lives of so many people in ways far greater than gymnastics or painting. Many, many will feel his loss. A Tribute to Rome Milan was held on Sunday, May 16th at Sokol Fort Worth. 
